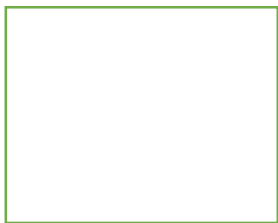
TOPIC: SAVE THE TURTLES

Why do we care? Our marine ecosystem is facing significant threats from overfishing, pollution, and climate change. Marine life plays an important role in maintaining the health of the world's ocean. Sea turtles have their place in the delicate network of life-providing services. They are an irreplaceable organism to the balanced ecosystem functioning, and yet, every year, more than 4000 sea turtles are killed in the US alone due to commercial fishing, plastic debris in the ocean, and loss of their natural habitat. 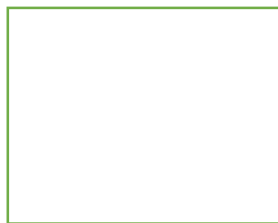

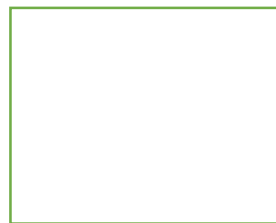
Pick one of your assigned colors to complete this exercise:



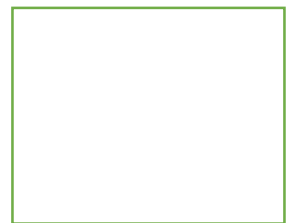
Your color
